Collective Worship Policy





"Collective Worship should promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of the pupils at the school taking into account their family background, age and aptitude and to prepare such pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life"

(1988 Education Act)

Aim of the policy:

The aim of the collective worship policy is to provide the opportunity for children to:

- worship God
- reflect on values that are of a broadly Christian nature and on their own beliefs
- develop a community spirit, a common ethos and shared values
- reflect on British Values and prepare children for life in Modern Britain
- consider spiritual and moral issues
- respond to the worship offered

Statutory Duty of School

All maintained schools provide daily collective worship for registered pupils (apart from those who have been withdrawn by their parents). This is provided at Wren's Nest within a daily assembly - the format and structure of which is varied throughout the week (refer to appendix 1). Whole School assemblies are planned termly by the Head Teacher in response to community related topics, festivals and celebrations that take place within the term (See appendix 2). Assembly content can be viewed within the Collective Worship and Assembly Evidence file as well on the School website. MS Teams will be used as an alternative source to deliver assemblies.

The Head Teacher is responsible (under the School Standards and Framework Act 1998) for arranging this daily collective worship after consulting with the Governing Body. The daily collective worship is wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character. At Wren's Nest we have a strong focus on developing shared values (including the promotion of British Values and preparing children for life in Modern Britain) and our ethos through the school assemblies. Through assemblies we also promote and use opportunities to raise self-esteem and celebrate success. The precise nature of the daily collective worship varies and is appropriate for the age of the children (refer to appendix 1 for specific assembly planner).

<u>Implementation</u>

Collective worship, whether in assembly (whole school / key stage specific) or at a specific time within class, will:

- be acceptable to the whole community, staff and children.
- include a variety of elements at different times
- involve the children.

<u>Information for parents and families</u>

Parents have a right to withdraw their children from collective worship. Provision will be made for these children during assembly. The Head Teacher is happy to discuss the format and structure of assemblies with parents and would be keen to do this prior to a parent's decision to withdraw a child from assemblies. Assemblies can be seen on the school website and are available for parents and families to view. Assemblies are available to view on the school website.
