Content and Sequencing

The Wren's Nest EYFS provides a four-tiered approach to early education. This is so children's

- Pre-School A focus on supporting children to be 'school ready', using a layered back approach from ✓ Reception. Children's developmental needs continue to be supported with an ongoing focus on the Prime Areas of learning. Specific Areas of learning continue to be focused upon during adult-focused Phonics and Maths sessions, as well as through the Enhanced Provision.
 - Reception A focus on the Prime and Specific Areas of learning, supporting children's developmental needs alongside daily Phonics and Maths sessions. Children experience a wider curriculum and become part of the wider community within school. Children are supported for the next stage in their education at Wren's Nest.
