Famous rivers around the world:

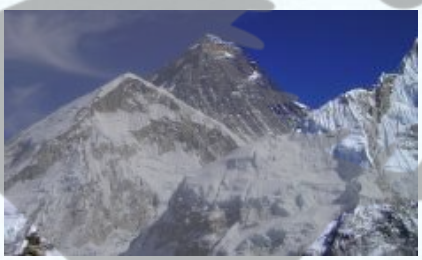
- Amazon River**- Carries the most water.
