

# News from the Nest 3rd September 2019

Dear Parents,

I hope you have had a good summer holiday with your children and families, and they return ready and refreshed for an exciting Autumn term at Wren's Nest.

It is a privilege to be writing to you for the first time as acting Headteacher at Wren's Nest. I know many of you well and look forward to working with you as we move through the forthcoming academic year. I have been at Wren's Nest for 11 years and my heart really does belong here. I want to take this opportunity to assure you that I will do my very best for both the children and families within the Wren's Nest community.

I am delighted to be able to welcome you back with some great news. We heard at the very end of the Summer term that Wren's Nest had been successful in retaining the national GOLD SPORTS AWARD

for Schools for a third year running. There is a very long list of criteria which schools have to meet to attain this award and includes taking part in competitions in at least 11 different sports, making sure all children in school enjoy high quality PE and have a raised awareness of the importance of a healthy lifestyle. I would like to thank Mrs Abbiss for all her hard work in leading the work at Wren's Nest and all the staff who have supported our quest for the award by running sports clubs or taking children to competitions.

Our school curriculum continues to develop and flourish and we are very proud of the number of trips and educational visits we offer our children. These visits motivate the children and enhance their

learning of the topics we cover in our curriculum. I know of no other school which provides the number and range of trips that Wren's Nest offers. We ask for a parental contribution of £15 per child towards the total cost of the trips - an amount that many schools charge just for one trip. This contribution generates an income of £4,000 towards the costs of providing the trips (a total cost to the school budget of over £35,000). Our budget remains increasingly hard to manage and we would be grateful if you would

pay this parental contribution during the first half term of the school year. This year we are asking for you to make your payment for school trips and visits via Eduspot. If you have not yet used this online payment system, please see the office staff for details.

I hope you and your child enjoy a great start to the new term. If you have any questions or worries please pop in and either see your child's class teacher or ask at the school office - we are all here to help!

### Letters and forms

Together with this newsletter you should have received some other information. We decided that it was easier to give you all the letters at one time in an envelope to prevent them getting lost in children's trays or book bags! All information you give will be updated and recorded in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations and Schools' Privacy Notice. Included you should have:

<u>Trips and visits letter</u> (Orange form) - This letter asks you for a contribution of £15 towards your child's visits programme for the whole year. We feel it is only fair that all parents are asked to make this contribution for each child that they have at Wren's Nest. The school subsidises each child by at least £75. Please read carefully the details of the school trip money going cashless via the Eduspot app on the back of this form.



<u>Permission for local visits</u> (Blue form) - Each year we need to ask you to complete a permission form to enable your child to take part in activities in the local area outside the school gates. These activities are always planned and you will be informed before such activities take place. Please complete this form and return it via your child to their class teacher.

<u>School Lunches</u> (Yellow sheet) Dudley Catering have increased the price of a school dinner from £2.30 to <u>£2.40</u> per day with effect from Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September. The cost of milk shake and fruit juice remain at 20p for children in KS2. Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 receive a free drink of milk as part of the government free school lunch initiative. The menu covers our school lunches until October half term.

Food and tuck items remain at 15p per item (round of toast, yoghurt and fruit).

<u>Clubs Letter</u> - This letter will be given out separately this week and will tell you the clubs which are being offered to your child's year group this term. Our clubs are very popular and last year we had around 200 children taking part in clubs each week! We will make sure your child can take part in one of the clubs but obviously there are a limited number of spaces for each club which is why we request 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> choice preferences as well.
