As a school, we wanted to continue to maintain a high standard of Sports teaching and experiences for all children whenever possible due to much inactivity as a result of COVID 19 restrictions and habits which have since formed. This year, we have been successful in achieving the Platinum Sports Award as well as the Gold Healthy Living award. We will maintain the Platinum Award as we enter the academic year 2023/24, continuing to promote active and healthy lifestyles for the whole family.

For 2023/24, we will continue to receive a grant of £19,500 Sports Premium money. Planned expenditure is similar to last year (2022/23) with some increased costs to cover our sporting competition expenses as well as support staff with continued professional development within the subject. We are hoping to build upon the achievements of last year and continue to be increasingly successful in sporting competitions. Capacity in school to deliver high quality PE continues to grow as we have a dedicated member of the Senior Leadership Team who will support the development of PE and Healthy Living teaching and learning at Wren's Nest. This is in addition to, two members of staff who are able to deliver a specialist PE role and support across the school. The impact of this increased expertise is sustainable within our staffing budget.
