8:20am—Doors open for Early Birds

8:40am—Doors open **

9:00am—Gates close. Children are now late and must be signed in at the main school office by an adult with a valid reason given.

** Children start the school day by doing an 'Early start' session which includes feedback on the previous day's learning, wellbeing

Absence Procedures

- Please inform the school office if your child will be absent from school.
- You may be asked to supply medical evidence such as medication or appointment letters . Please arrange appointments outside of school hours where possible.
- If you have not contacted school, Mrs Hill or Mrs Cadman will contact you to find out the reason for absence.
- Mrs Hill or Mrs Cadman may also contact you at the end of the school day to enquire about your child and discuss their return to school the following day. They will continue to contact you each day that your child is absent to check in and offer support where possible.

We are proud to celebrate outstanding commitment and dedication to attendance! Year 1 and Year 6 were identified as year groups that were losing more days of learning than we would have liked. They were given a 4 week time scale to improve and both year groups smashed their target! Well done!

This term Year 2 and Year 6 were the lowest attenders so again a target has been set and I'm sure this can be achieved too. Come on Year 2 and Year 6!

Our attendance leaders at the moment are Year 3 and Year 4 with **95.1%** and **95.2%** attendance.

Our current attendance rate stands at **93%** — a great achievement that reflects everyone's commitment and effort! However, our goal is to reach **94%**, and we know we can get there together. Every day counts — let's continue to show up, support one another and achieve 94%

- **Sticky Knowledge:** School is where children acquire knowledge and skills that are crucial for their personal and professional growth. Missing days means missing out on valuable learning opportunities.
- **Preventing Knowledge Gaps:** Frequent absences can lead to significant knowledge gaps, making it challenging for children to catch up with missed lessons, potentially resulting in long-term academic struggles.
- **Building Routine:** School attendance establishes a structured routine in children's lives, teaching them time management and responsibility, which are valuable life skills.

Wise Up Levels

Attendance Wise Up Levels

Attendance is 97% and above – absent for less than 6 days in the year. Your child is giving themselves the best chance of achieving their full potential at school. They are **Wised Up!**

Attendance is 95-97% - absent for less than 10 days in the year. Your child is **Wise** regarding attendance and has a good opportunity to achieve at school.

Attendance is 93-95% - missing up to 13 days in the year. You and your child **could be wiser**. These absences make it difficult for your child to achieve their best.

Attendance is 90 - 93% - missing up to 19 days a year! Your child needs to **Wise Up**. Missing so much time makes it very hard for your child to keep in touch with lessons.

Attendance is below 90%! You could be found to be failing in your duty as a parent, regarding your child's attendance. You and your child need to **Wise Up Now**. Missing so much time from school means it will be almost impossible for your child to keep in touch with their lessons.

Thank you for your on-going support regarding promoting good attendance and punctuality - both important life skills that provide a successful future for your children.
