We begin by looking at where we go to school. Do you know the full name of our school?



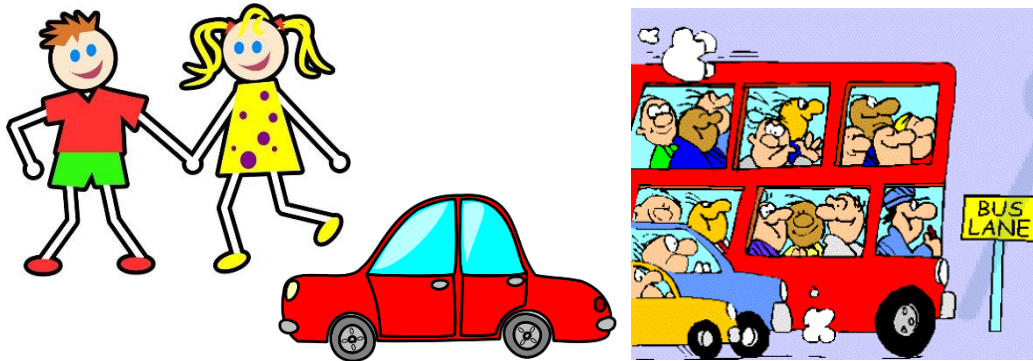
Next, we look at where we live. Some of you live really close to school. Some of you might live a little further away.

Can you name the four countries that make up the United Kingdom?



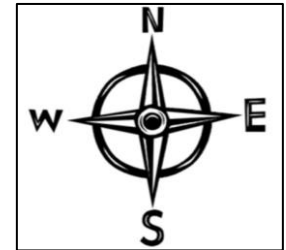
Fact
