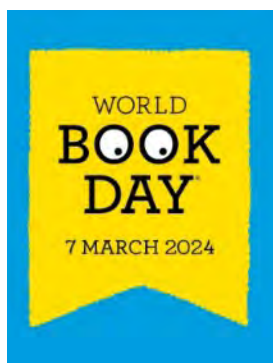


**Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2024**

## World Book Day Costume Ideas

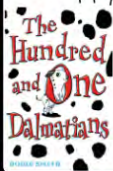
If you're struggling for inspiration, here are a few fairly straightforward costume ideas to help you get started!



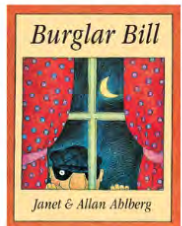
A black cape from Hallowe'en over a white t-shirt and black trousers makes an instant witch or wizard

(Floppy ears optional)



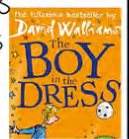
A black and white stripy top and a paper mask is all you need for Burglar Bill

David Walliams' 'The Boy in the Dress' only needs 3 things: a dress, football socks and trainers

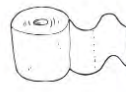


Animal onesies are a ready made costume! A tiger could be Coming to Tea, a fox could be watching the Little Brown Mouse... Books are full of animals they could be!
