## Significant People

Samuel Pepys (23rd February 1633 - 26th

May 1703) was an administrator of the navy in England and Member of Parliament who is most famous for the diary he kept for a decade covering The Plague and The Great Fire



More than 70,000 people were made homeless.

The Great Fire of London swept through the central parts of the English city from Sunday, 2<sup>®</sup>September to Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> September 1666.

## Did you know?

The Great Fire started at the bakery (or baker's house) of Thomas Farrinor (or Farynor) on Pudding Lane shortly after midnight on Sunday, 2<sup>nd</sup> September, and spread rapidly west across the City of London.



The fire lasted four days, and burned down over13,000 homes.

## Significant People

Sir Christopher Wren (30th October 1632 - 8th March 1723) was an English anatomist(expert in the body), astronomer (expert in space knowledge), geometer (knowledge of land and countries), and mathematician-physicist, as well as one of the most



highly acclaimed English architects (designer and builder) in history.

He had responsibility for rebuilding 52 churches in the City of London after the Great Fire in 1666.
